

Vaccines save lives and help protect against harmful infectious diseases such as whooping cough, measles and the flu.

The Immunisation Clinic provides immunisation services to women and children who are current inpatients and outpatients of the Women's and Children's Hospital.

The general public, visitors to the hospital and patients of other hospitals cannot access these services.

The Immunisation Clinic

Services available

The Immunisation Clinic offers the following services:

- > Routine and catch-up immunisations for children and adolescents.
- > Additional immunisations for medically at risk children and adolescents e.g. following chemotherapy, solid organ transplant, chronic renal disease.
- > Scheduled maternal immunisations.
- > Some immunisations for family members of medically at risk patients are available at a cost and dependant on stock availability, such as:
 - > flu vaccine
 - > whooping cough vaccine for partners/ parents of pregnant women.
- > Immunisation advice and information for individuals and families.

Attending the clinic

A booked appointment or a drop-in service is available.

Opening hours

9:00am - 4:30pm Monday to Friday.

The clinic is closed weekends and public holidays.

When attending the clinic please bring the following:

- > Medicare card
- > Child Health Record (Blue Book) or
- > SA Pregnancy Record (Orange Book).



The Immunisation Clinic

Check if your child's immunisations are up to date on your smart phone

- > Access your Medicare account online through myGov.

If you don't have a myGov account, you can create one and then link it to your Medicare account.

- > Use the free Express Plus Medicare mobile app.

If you don't have the app, you can access through the App Store or Google Play.



If your child is not up-to-date with their immunisations, advise the staff so that the appropriate vaccinations can be arranged.
